HISTORY OF 97TH GENERAL HOSPITAL 5 APRIL TO 15 JULY 1944

1. 56 Officers, 1 Warrant Officer, 500 Enlisted Men arrived at Parkhouse B, Wilts 5 April 1944. These were temporary quarters, living quarters being tents, with offices, mess facilities and supplies Nissen huts. 88 Nurses, 3 Hospital Dietitians, and 2 Physio-therapists were quartered in private billets at Swindon, Wilts. Both groups went through orientation and staging while at these respective locations.
2. The 97th General Hospital is located approximately 5/10 of a mile from the village of Wheatley, Oxon, Map Coordinates are 0425, Ordnance Survey GB 1/63,000 (10 Mile Map).
3. This organization was ordered to open this hospital in accordance with letter, File AG 323.3 OPMC. Subject: Opening of Hospitals, Headquarters, European Theater of Operations, dated 17 April 1944. (See Appendix "A" for copies of letter)
4. Boundaries and location are shown on map, marked Appendix "B" change in geographical location this hospital 21 April 1944.
5. See Appendix "C" for roster of officers and nurses. No changes have been made and it is felt that a graph would be unnecessary.
6. Colonel Knox Dunlap, O-19667, MC, was born in Marlinton, West Virginia, May 8, 1903. Colonel Dunlap has commanded this organization since activation on 25 June 1943 at Fort Bragg, North Carolina. He has taken the utmost care in the placing of his officers and enlisted men best suited to their talents, striving always to build this hospital into one of the best in the Medical Department. Colonel Dunlap has made every effort in securing recreation for the enlisted men of this command and those efforts have borne fruit. Numerous motion pictures have been shown to both the patients and detachment members of this hospital. Outstanding entertainers have been brought here, and all USO shows functioning in this vicinity are immediately booked for performances. Merale of this organization has been exceedingly high since date of existence.
7. The different departments of this hospital have undergone many changes. In many cases the physical arrangement of various departmental buildings proved a handicap. The Chiefs of departments however have shown a great deal of individual ingenuity and these handicaps are rapidly diminishing.

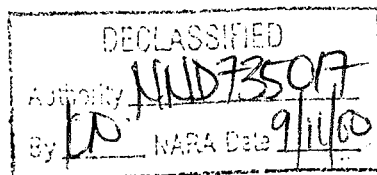

(a) In the Surgical section a few minor changes have been made. The Chief of Surgical Service although satisfied with the

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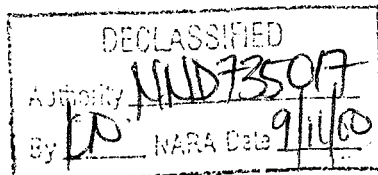


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operating theaters in themselves, has made a few minor changes which help in smoother functioning. Over 800 operations have been performed in these theaters. An emergency operating room has been set up in Surgical Ward 19, and will serve as a great asset in the case of emergency if the operating theater is filled to capacity.

- (b) The X-ray service also is under handicap by physical arrangement of building. Lack of proper equipment made work difficult at times. Individual ingenuity of different members of this service has also made possible a smooth, easy running department. Developing tanks and dark room were reconstructed. These and many more items have been changed to aid in the increased efficiency of this department.
- (c) The EENT Clinic found the physical set up of the building satisfactory. The only change made was the enlarging of doors entering the building so that a wheel chair or litter might be able to pass through. Desks and file cabinets were obtained. One room has been arranged to be used for emergency surgery. The ear, nose, and throat room is separated from the eye examination and treatment room.
- (d) The Dental service underwent a great change upon our arrival. All make-shift equipment was taken out and replaced by equipment built by our utilities department and personnel of the dental service. The Chief of Service rearranged the entire set up. The laboratory is separate, oral surgery is also in a private room. General dental work is done in one of the larger rooms with 4 chairs operating at once. A new dental x-ray machine has been procured, which makes for better work in all sections.
- (e) Medical supply has estimated handling between 85 and 100 tons of equipment. In all probability three quarters of a million dollars is represented in this equipment. Most of the non-expendable equipment has been installed in the different sections and wards where they are required. Linen exchange has been centralized with new shelves and containers built. Excess supplies have been returned to depots. 98% of required equipment on TBA has been filled.
- (f) The Chief of Medical Service has met with no handicaps and has found all the wards in perfect functioning order.
- (g) This organization handles 3 messes. The patients, detachment, and officers and nurses. Since the arrival of the 97th each mess hall has been painted twice. The census of the patients' mess at present increases and decreases in an abnormal fashion. Its peak feeding was 1046. New equipment for this department has been arriving in spurts, and although the great number to be fed at times presented difficulties, it was done in a fast and excellent manner.
- (h) The Unit Supply in addition to handling the equipment of the detachment also supplies equipment and clothing to the

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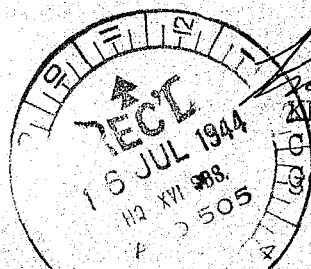
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patients. It is estimated that at least 75,000 pounds of clothing and equipment have been issued to the patients alone. Over 800 pairs of shoes, 1400 pairs of drawers and undershirts have been issued. This work has been executed by only 3 men.

- (i) The utilities section has been constantly busy since arriving here. Their greatest single feat is the record breaking time in which they laid cement bases for ward tents with sidewalks to connect with main walks of the hospital. Covers were erected over the main walks. This has paid dividends by protecting from inclement weather patients being transported to and from the operating theater and the various clinics. This department has furnished all sections with file cabinets and tables of all sizes and descriptions. They have hauled and delivered over 500 tons of coal and coke. They have installed two electric generators to be used in case the normal supply of electrical current should fail. These generators are placed in positions to give the best service. One is 3000 watts and the other 10,000 watts.
- (j) The motor pool has been commended several times on the fine way they keep equipment in running order. They are the finest appearing vehicles in this area. Totaled the mileage these vehicles have traveled comes to over 80,000 miles since 22 April 1944.
- (k) The administrative sections of headquarters have handled immense quantities of work. Although the amount of work can not be estimated, the turn over in patients serves to some idea of the work accomplished. The hospital has admitted over 2800 patients, the bulk of these arriving after "D" Day. Administrative problems were met and handled with very little delay in the normal functioning of the organization.
8. On 25 June 1944 the unit held a birthday party. It celebrated its first year of service in the United States Army. A full day of entertainment was arranged. The Medical Service challenged the Surgical Service to a game of soft ball. The officers, nurses and enlisted men were all represented. A supper party was held in all three messes, and a dance for the enlisted men was held in the Red Cross Building. Several members of the detachment were awarded the Good Conduct Ribbon at a formal Retreat held in front of hospital Headquarters.
